Dear Sir:

Your letter of February 18 is received. I note that you expect to send a few plants of Kokia rockii to the Azores if they germinate successfully at Coimbra. I think it would be a good idea to try this Kokia there to see what effect the different soil there might have upon its growth.

With regard to Quercus insignis I would say that at the present time we are not in a position to send out seed of this oak. We are constantly endeavoring to procure additional quantities of this seed, however, and should we secure a sufficient quantity in the future we will take pleasure in sending you a small amount of seed.
